#### 1.- General information about Trinidad and Tobago

The Republic of Trinidad and Tobago comprises two islands at the southern-most end of the Caribbean archipelago with an area of 5, 128 km<sup>2</sup>. Port of Spain is the capital city and the currency is the Trinidad and Tobago dollar (**U.S. \$ 1 = TT\$ 6.40**). The country has the largest commercially viable source of natural asphalt in the world, with the official language being English, and the population being 1,310 million people. The Honourable Kamla Persad-Bissesar is the Prime Minister, the Honourable Anthony Carmona, President, and the Honourable Winston Dookeran, Minister of Foreign Affairs.

June and July mark the beginning of the rainy season and are the wettest months of the year with an average annual rainfall about 200 cm (40 inches).

The areas in and around Port of Spain may experience half day/early afternoon thundershowers after a sunny morning.

Maximum temperature: 31 degrees Celsius (afternoon) Minimum temperature: 23 degrees Celsius (just before dawn) The relative humidity varies between 65 and 97 percent. 
#### 6. – Ground Transfers

Delegates will organize their transportation from the airport as well as to the meeting venue. Taxis are available at the airport and hotel of choice. The fare


from the airport cost approximately USD\$25.00 to USD\$35.00 and USD\$10.00 around the city.

### 7. - Accommodation








#### 9. – Visas

Delegates are asked to make their visa requests to the Embassy of Trinidad and Tobago or British High Commission accredited to their respective countries, at least two weeks before commencing their travel. *Only in the cases of countries where there is no Embassy or High Commission*, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Trinidad and Tobago will assist in procuring visa waivers for delegates, provided that information on names, dates of birth, passport numbers, date of issue and expiry are forwarded to the Secretariat **at least two weeks before commencement of travel**. Beyond this period, the Secretariat will not be able to guarantee that visas will be obtained locally.
